2005 Budget Approved

Yard Sign Question

The Board was asked a question recently regarding yard signs. The following should be used as a guideline:

- City regulations do not permit signs of any type on the city easement. This is generally the area between the sidewalk and the road.
- To post a sign that is larger than 2 ft. X 3ft., a letter should be written to the board stating the location and date the sign will be posted. This is to keep the board informed. The sign should be posted for a maximum of 7 days.
- Posting a sign in a yard other than your own requires permission of the property owner.

Dues Past Due

Homes Association dues were to be paid in January. Liens are placed on properties with delinquent dues. To clear the title of the property, you must pay the past due amount plus the lien filing fees. some cash, pay your dues NOW!

Brookside Watershed Improvement Project

If you have driven down Wornall Road, Pennsylvania Avenue, or Huntington Road you have seen that the Brookside Watershed Improvement Program is currently underway. Following is a brief update detailing the status of each phase:

- 1. Phase 1 Local repairs in Brookside and Crestwood were completed in Spring 2002 on schedule.
- Phase 2 Huntington Relief Sewers design is complete. Construction was scheduled to begin December 2004 but did not start until Spring 2005. Original anticipated completion date was Spring 2006.
- Phase 3 Brookside Neighborhood Improvements survey work, soil drilling and sampling are complete and final design is significantly complete. Anticipated

- construction is Summer 2006 Spring 2008.
- Phase 4 Crestwood Neighborhood Improvements survey work, soil drilling and sampling are complete. Final design is underway. Anticipated construction is Summer 2005 - Fall 2006.
- 5. Phase 5 Brookside Interceptor preliminary design has begun. Soil drilling and sampling is complete for the preliminary phase. Detailed design is expected to begin in Spring 2005. Construction will be bid under two separate contracts, and is expected to begin in September 2007 and be complete by the end of 2012 pending availability of funding.
