

MIL Levy Increase

The Board has been notified by the Homes Association of the Country Club District (HACCD), the umbrella organization for our homes association, will be increasing their administrative costs that are assessed to the 40 homes associations of HACCD in 2006. Previous assessment increases from HACCD have not been passed on to the homeowners by the CCHA board. However, with this increase and postage increasing next year, the Homes Association can no longer cover these increased costs and still maintain a balanced budget. At the annual meeting on Saturday, October 1, you will be asked to approve a .25 mil levy increase.

Depending on the front footage of your lot, the increase would be \$1.75 to \$2.75 per year. Our Homes Asso-

ciation already enjoys some of the lowest annual assessments in all of the HACCD associations since we do not have any public ground to maintain (islands, fountains, parks, etc.). Please vote yes on October 1.(Continued on page 2.)

Delinquencies on Dues

Twelve property owners have not paid their homes association dues. These were due in January of this year. Liens are placed on properties with delinquent dues. To clear the title of the property, you must pay the past due amount plus the lien filing fees. Property owners past due are: 429 W. 57th St., 421 W. 58th St., 613 W. 58th St., 417 W. 59 St., 401 W. 59th Terr., 416 W. 59th Terr., 440 W. 59th Terr., 642 W. 59th Terr., 418 W. 60th Terr., 427 W. 60th Terr., 432 W. 61st St., 640, W. 61st. St. Property owners with delinquent dues will not be able to receive a clear title to sell their home or to refinance

until all past due homes association dues plus the lien filing fees are paid.

Snow Removal

There are still funds from previously collected special assessments for snow removal. With minimal snow the past couple of years, these funds are still earmarked for snow removal. However, each year association members must vote to use these funds. Special assessments can only be used for the purpose that they were collected.

Board Members Needed

At the annual meeting on October

1, you will also be voting on the election of several board members. To be a board member, you must be a member in good standing in the association. This includes paid-up dues, and no unresolved complaints against the property. If you are interested, contact any current board member so that you can be included on the ballot.

Neighborhood Potpourri

Misdelivered Mail

Ever receive a piece of mail that was not yours? Mistakes happen but they can be easily remedied. If the address is nearby, enjoy a nice walk in the neighborhood and deliver it to the correct address. You can write on the envelope, "try again" or just drop the envelope back in the mail to be redelivered. Writing "Not at this Address" returns the item to the sender and could cause further complications for the addressee.

HACCD Covenants

You may have read about some restrictive covenants in some

HACCD associations. These covenants were ruled unenforceable in the 1940s and illegal in the 1960s. However, removing the language from the deed documents was complex and costly.

Under the provisions of a new law that went into effect July 12, 2005, the offensive covenants can be voted out of existence by a simple majority vote of the association's board of directors. Then actually removing the language involves filing legal documents and in some cases, multiple documents with the county.

John Sheets, HACCD Executive

Director, is working with an attorney to prepare the appropriate documents for the Missouri associations that are legally required to make these changes by the end of the year.

Iron-clad covenants create a strong network of homes associations and even today protect the residential character and charm of our neighborhoods. Any racist language in CCHA's deed covenants will be removed by the end of the year.
