
From The Treasurer

Howdy, neighbors!

Gardening and landscaping season is just around the corner. If you're looking to spruce up your lawn and garden don't forget to peruse the list of plants native to our area published by K-State Research and Extension at www.johnson.k-state.edu/natural-resources/Native-plants.html.

As you look forward to the changing of the seasons and plan new projects to renew and revitalize the exterior of your home and the outdoor spaces on your property, don't forget to submit your plans to your friendly neighborhood volunteer Architectural Review committee.

Crucial to the planning process is your perusal of the Declaration of Restrictions of Northwood Trails that you and every neighbor signed during the purchase of an NWT home. At the neighborhood's eNeighbors page, simply click on the Documents tab at the top. Under the Legal Documents section, click on Deed Restrictions. Items 3-4 on Page 1 establish the review committee and specify written approval is required "wherever this declaration specifies that written approval or consent must be obtained for any plan structures, additions, changes or appurtenances to the land bound by this declaration." Items 5-20 list the types of projects requiring approval, such as fencing and dog runs, covered decks and patios, roofing and siding materials, front door materials, outbuildings such as gazebos and the removal of trees larger than four inches in trunk diameter as measured two feet off the ground.

The all-volunteer board of directors appreciates your attention to detail as we all work together to keep home values high and abide by the rules to which we collectively agreed when we landed in the greatest neighborhood in Kansas!

Spring greetings, neighbors!

Northwood Trails' primary internet presence is our private neighborhood page found at www. eneighbors.com This community resource includes:

- The bulletin board, a place to post and read about neighborhood-related items, community news and concerns, school happenings such as performances and fundraisers, lost pets, found pets, lost and found items such as phones and keys.
- The classifieds: If you've got a service or item to sell, click "Post Classified" under the bulletin board heading. You may upload photos to draw potential buyers and communicate with them through the site. It's also a great place to offer free items for giveaway.
- The neighborhood directory: Look up your neighbors by first name, last name, address or simply view neighbors by street name in the directory. Find the names of your current all-volunteer board of directors with their role on the board and their contact information. Send messages to neighbors, a board member or even to all board members.
- The calendar: Sync your spring and summer with NWT. Find upcoming special events such as the Easter Egg hunt on April 8 and garage sales May 6 and Sept. 16, board meetings, committee meetings, pool opening dates, and more.
- form and view important legal documents, such as our deed restrictions, bylaws and articles of incorporation; Pool, pond and social committee documents; or get nostalgic with Board of Directors meeting minutes and newsletter archives dating to 2000.
- Your profile: Manage your contact information (seen only by NWT Homes Association members) and customize your website experience through your profile. To get to your profile, click your picture in the upper right corner, or the dropdown next to your picture and select profile.
- Your notifications: Set them as desired. In my case, I check every box with daily email. That way I stay on top of what is going on in the neighborhood. These notification preferences can be changed at any time if they are too much or too little. By default, email notifications are weekly, each Monday.

If you are new to eNeighbors and need support, you can email me at rickpickerill@gmail.com. There is also support available from eNeighbors and they typically respond in 24 hours or less.
