Our taxes pay for this snow removal, and it is just not happening. Looking inward we did contract with a new snow removal company this winter, and as with any new contractor we had our growing pains getting them trained to what we wanted them to do. Our contract with our vendor calls for the streets to be plowed when there are more than 3 inches of snow. That didn't really happen this year. The bigger problem was the ice, and we will work to be more effective with salt application in the next winter season. Please feel free to call me if you would like to discuss in person.

Overall Verona Hills has faired very well over the last few decades in terms of value and desirability of location. Our home values have continued to increase steadily. We can assure this trend by maintaining our properties. Speed Limits

Follow-up traffic studies made on Santa Fe Trail indicate the speed humps installed last summer have been effective in reducing speeds. The average speed between State Line and Pennsylvania reduced an average of 5 miles an hour after the humps were installed.

<u>Santa Fe Trail Improvements</u>

Property easements have been granted and right-of-way issues are resolved. Construction plans are ready to go out for bid on the widening and improvements to Santa Fe Trail between Wornall and Pennsylvania. Selection of a contractor and approval of a city ordinance are the next steps. Please continue to voice your support for this project to your elected officials. The street will likely be closed to through traffic during construction.

<u>Trash Talk</u>

Your Homes Association has negotiated the convenient Monday pickup for Verona Hills residents. While we once were considered a "Friday" area for special collections such as leaf and brush, our regular pickup day is now considered Monday for all collections.

BULKY ITEM PICKUP schedule:

April 16th * June 16th * August 18th * October 16th * December 16th Pick-up is in the 16th day of even-numbered months. If the 16th falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, items will be picked up the following work day. Help Line

The number to call for City Services is 3-1-1 for the City Action Center.

If you need action from the City of Kansas City, call the KCMO City Action Center at 3-1-1 or 816-513-1313. Hours of service are M-F from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. and weekends from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. You can leave a message after hours. Use this great tool to report pot holes, a broken water main, streets that are slick or haven't been plowed for snow, burned out streetlights, trees in the city right of way that need trimming; even to request speed control on your street. The list goes on and on. The City is usually very responsive and will give you a record number so that you can track resolution of your issue. One resident reported a streetlight repair was done in 24 hours!

Park Pond Plans

The pond in Migliazzo Park is to be stocked with catfish this spring. The fish help minimize the buildup of silt, keeping the pond cleaner. A group of volunteers just cleaned up trash and debris from the pond. Help us keep the pond clean by throwing trash in one of the barrels in the park.

Common Area Updates

We continue to look for common areas that are past their prime and need to be reinvigorated. We like to get the direct involvement of the homeowners around the common area to help with some basics when there are new plantings. <u>Free Parking</u>

Please remember that parking your car in the street creates difficulty for snow removal equipment, fire trucks and ambulances – especially at night. While in some situations it cannot be helped, please use available space in your garage or driveway first. Think about a snowplow trying to get through before you park your car on the street. Thank you for doing what you can to help us keep our streets clear and our neighborhood safe and attractive.

Cars parked in the same spot on the street for more than 48 hours may be reported to the city as a nuisance. Phone (816) 531-1313 or just dial 3-1-1.

What can we do to control the goose population at Migliazzo Park? Bill B.

Bill,

The city has placed fox decoys around the park to discourage nesting. We will evaluate their effectiveness to determine if more action is necessary. City crews also do periodic cleaning of goose "remnants."

Dear Jim, What are Homes Association covenants regarding rental property? Mark M.

Mark,

While the Homes Association has no specific covenants regarding this subject, the City of Kansas City recently instituted a new law regarding registration of rental property. All owners of rental dwellings located in Kansas City, MO must now register their properties with the City's Neighborhood and Community Services Department.

"By more actively monitoring rental properties through the Rental Registration and Inspection Program, we will not only serve renters better but we also will help improve the condition of all neighborhoods, which benefits all residents," said Daniel Schmelzinger, manager of the Neighborhood Preservation Division. For each month (or portion thereof) after February 2008 that a rental dwelling is not registered, an additional \$50 fee will be assessed. For example, a rental property not registered until August will be assessed a fine of \$350.

Registration is required on a calendar-year basis and will expire each Dec. 31. We will be sending our list of known Verona Hills rental properties to the City to ensure compliance with the new law.

That's a great question. Overall, Verona Hills is an attractive, well-maintained and safe community. Statistics on home sales and crime prove this to be true. There are many things we all do to keep it this way. Three of the most important are:

- 1. Park cars off the street keep them in your garage and driveways.
- 2. Keep trash, yard waste and bulky items out of sight until the day before a trash pickup.

3. Keep your house and property well-lit, both inside and out. This enhances the image of your home and is an effective crime deterrent.
