### **Board Actions – 2009 Budget**

The budget for 2009 has been developed and has been adopted by the Board. A copy of the budget is attached to this newsletter. The 2008 budget is also shown for comparison. For 2009 we are projecting a \$15,000 overrun which when added to the 2008 overrun, we could be beyond \$25,000 over budget. As *stated* last year and in the annual meeting, the Association cannot operate with such a deficit.

Also note that additional services have been included in the budget. The primary cost increase is the extra fall clean-up which was started in 2008. The iron treatment of the pin-oaks is also included in the budget. The board has also approved snow removal for the interior sidewalk even if snow removal from drives is not required. This additional service is to accommodate those who walk their dogs and to give better access to the mail boxes. The decision to remove the snow will depend on the accumulation and expected weather conditions.

#### **Board Actions - Dues Increase**

Based on these projected overruns, the Board has authorized a \$10.00 per month increase in dues. The increase will cover the shortfall and hopefully will mean increases will not be required for next year. Much of the projected expenditure is influenced by the amount of snow removal required. Future dues will also depend on the costs incurred for trash removal and lawn care. Our contract with Aspen expires at the end of 2009 and we hope to negotiate a multi-year contract that will contain predefined modest increases in service costs.

Increasing dues in the current economy is not an easy decision, but the Board unanimously agrees that we cannot continue to operate at the deficit levels we have experienced and predict for the remainder of the year. There have been no dues increases since 2000 and if we can continue the dues structure for two more years, the yearly average increase will be only one percent.

The dues increase will be effective May 1, 2009 and will be reflected in the HACCD May billing. For those who have automatic withdrawal there will be a notice in your bill requesting a signed authorization. No voided check will be necessary.

#### Trash Collection

Deffenbaugh is changing their collection policy by adopting a tiered plan with different costs per tier. A short summary of each tier is provided below:

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Gold Level – \$10.25 per month: Deffenbaugh will provide a 65 gallon poly-cart (no charge) for each home.

Silver Level – \$10.75 per month: Deffenbaugh will provide a 95 gallon poly-cart (no charge) for each home. The 2009 budget is based on the silver level and is less than we currently pay.

Bronze level – \$12.25 per month: No container is provided.

There are several items still being developed by Deffenbaugh and some of them will be driven by Overland Park, the county and the state. We will not change our service to the new carts until we know more about Deffenbaugh's program and we have received input from our Owners.
