Latest on: landscaping, grass fungus, board openings, lost key, etc.

Scrounds director <u>Tony Fink</u> received two calls complaining about Summit's mowers causing wheel tracks in their lawns. He checked it out immediately and found both owners had watered their lawns that day with up to an inch of water standing in some areas. "I recommend watering on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday **but never Wednesday night or Thursday**. If it rains Thursday, turn your water off on Friday or you risk wheel ruts and spreading fungus on your lawn. Also be alert to notices posted on our mailboxes from Summit on upcoming treatments."

>Forsooth! A Westmonter recently saw another resident toss a bag down one of our storm sewers. (Probably unrelated but two city storm sewer trucks were seen working in our neighborhood a few days later.) Please use the nearby Recycling Center on Hardy to dispose of items if you don't use a service; check local papers for where/when to take used paint, oil, etc.

>Found! "I live at 11928 Mackey. Someone delivered a package for me and mistakenly dropped their mail key at my door. It has a pink curly cord attached. Call <u>Maureen Wise</u> at 696-1182."

>Fungus alert! Due to heavy May rains followed by unseasonable heat, some Westmont lawns may suffer stress spots. Tony Fink recommends applying a bag of Infuse or other fungicide.

>A BIG thank-you to the Landscape Committee comprised of <u>Ken Knese</u>, <u>Don Niemackl</u>, <u>Mary</u> <u>Fink</u>, <u>Kris Johnson</u> and especially <u>Shirley Knese</u> (who put in many hours soliciting bids and visiting local nurseries) for their research on choosing which of four landscaping companies to upgrade Westmont's two entrances and islands and the 119th Terr. island.

The final plan by A Cut Above was presented by Shirley at the board's June 13 meeting and approved. The landscaping began June 21 and "hopefully residents will be pleased with the work," says Shirley, "in particular the much-needed improvement at the Antioch and 119th corner. I thank the committee for their time and effort to beautify our neighborhood and stay within budget."

>Kudos to Ken Knese who helps Tony keep an eye on Summit's mowing and also follows-up.

>Board opportunities. Three current board members' terms expire the end of 2011 with owners voting on candidates at Westmont's Annual Meeting in October. Here's your chance to let your voice be heard. Contact board president <u>Brenen Frye</u> if interested (see email/phone on backside).

>Troubleshooting work's been done on the **lights and sprinkler problems** at the Antioch entrance but wiring concerns still remain, which Tony Fink is pursuing with the city of Overland Park. If the city claims it didn't do any damage during its Antioch widening construction last summer he'll solicit three bids for finding/fixing the problem permanently.

>Tony's counted at least **30 oak trees** in Westmont he believes have iron deficiencies. The board will decide if, when and how to best treat, possibly including some of the trees treated last summer.
