What's the 3-1-1?

3-1-1 is Kansas City's central point of contact for city services. What can 3-1-1 do for you? Respond to property or nuisance complaints, schedule a big trash pickup, pay your water bill, and much more! You can contact the Kansas City action center through the KCMO website at www.kcmo.org, calling 3-1-1, or by email at 3-1-1.call.center.kcmo.org.

REMINDER:

Thursday November 29th is our city leaf pickup. Please remember:

- Sacks and bundles should be curbside by 7 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.
- No more than 20 sacks and/or bundles per household.
- Sacks and bundles must not weigh more than 40 pounds each.
- Use only **paper lawn debris sacks**. No plastic bags.
- If you seal sacks, use masking tape only; do not use plastic or duct tape.
- No grass clippings. No trash.
- All branches must be bundled. Branches must not be more than 3 inches in diameter.
- Bundles of branches must not be more than 2 feet in diameter and not more than 4 feet long.
- Use twine or jute rope to tie bundles; do not use wire or plastic tape.
- If wet weather is forecast, cover sacks/bundles with clear plastic.
