#### **CHA** Homeowners Love Trees

One of the things that makes Crestwood special is our trees.

Crestwood partnered with KCMO and neighbors to get trees replaced on the street in the right of way.

As seen in the Star recently, due to budget cuts far fewer trees are being planted than would be warranted.

At the request of the CHA board, KCMO agreed to have an arborist survey Crestwood and recommend where and what types of trees could be planted.

The arborist came up with locations for call or e-mail. Once I have a new list, some 40 trees. The board asked the homeowners to cover 1/4th of the cost. KCMO covered half and the CHA board covered the other 1/4th. The trees cost about \$220 each planted. So homeowners were asked to contribute \$55 and promise to water the trees.

We asked those on the list if they wanted a tree and many did. In the end 18 new trees were planted in February.

It is not too late if you think you have a place in the city right of way where a tree could be planted. Give me, Ken Spare a

KCMO will have the arborist come out and verify the request, and recommend a tree from the approved list. Remember types of trees are recommended based on location and the amount of area available for them. Trees between the curb and sidewalk are limited in size to protect sidewalks and curbs from damage. You can recommend a type of tree from the approved planting list.
