Armour Fields Selects Chesley Brown International as New Security Company

The Armour Fields Homes Association has hired Chesley Brown International as its new security contractor, effective January 1 of this year. Chesley Brown can be contacted 24 hours a day, seven days a week, at either of the following phone numbers: 816-753-2945 or 816-753-2946.

Chesley Brown is a security company which currently handles security for the Country Club Plaza, Brookside and Kauffman Foundation, to name a few locations in our general part of the city.

The new contract calls for an increased level of security service at a cost which is close to that charged by the neighborhood's former security service provider.

Chesley Brown will provide security patrols, similar to those our neighborhood as enjoyed for the past several years. In addition, for those who pay Armour Fields security dues, ChesleyBrown also provides motorist assists such as jumpstarts, towing, 24-hour alarm responses, escorts and calls for service. It will also prepare crime, incident and accident reports upon request.

Those who are out of town or on vacation can request extra security checks on their homes for the times when they are gone.

Southwest Early College Campus to Open in Sep.

The Kansas City, Missouri School District will be opening the Southwest Early College Campus next August at the site of the former Southwest High School at 65th and Wornall Road. This property is within the boundaries of the Armour Fields Homes Association.

The school will open with grades 6 and 9, and two grades will be added each subsequent year until grades 6 through 12 are in place. This school will have a math/science focus and there will be an open-enrollment process including a family conference ensuring that both parents and students are willing to commit to the academically rigorous standards of the school.

Take Advantage of 3-1-1 Action Center

Did you know that the City of Kansas City has a 3-1-1 Action Center phone line that is staffed eight or more hours a day, including weekends? It's true; you can call 3-1-1 to talk to a real live City employee who will record your call, relay it to the appropriate City office and send you a follow-up report.

The 3-1-1 Action Center is staffed from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on weekdays and from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.

The Action Center is modeled after the 9-1-1 emergency service, but is for anything but emergencies! If your call relates to streets, sidewalks, snow removal, trash, code violations or any other function of City government or services, then 3-1-1 is for you.

Security Tip: Keep Your Car Keys by the Bed

A security expert has recently recommended that you keep your car keys beside your bed at night. Why? Because if you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, you can just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, the horn will blare, and you may scare away the thief.

Your car security system is one that you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it out (hopefully not in the middle of the night, out of respect for your neighbors), and you will probably find that it will go off from most everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain.

Also, remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there.

This could also be useful for any emergency, such as a heart attack, where you can't reach a phone.

Safe and Secure

As you already know from the article on page 1 of this issue, Armour Fields has hired a new security company to patrol our little piece of Kansas City.

Chesley Brown International began servicing our community on January 1, 2008, and has been very responsive to the needs of our residents.

Several of you have already called to have a special watch while you were out of town, others have called to report suspicious behavior, and some have benefited from a jump start for their car on a cold January morning. These are all services that are in addition to the patrols that take place each day.

Another great benefit of Chesley Brown's service is alarm response. Simply notify your home security alarm company, and they will walk you through adding Chesley Brown as your patrol company. The contact numbers to use are 816-753-2945 or 816-753-2946.

When your alarm system sends a signal to the monitoring company, they will in turn contact Chesley Brown, who will respond in minutes to your home. Even

during non-patrol hours, security will typically have a better response time than the police department. This is because they are well staffed and can reallocate resources quickly.

As the weather improves you will see a new side to security in our neighborhood, bike patrols. Chesley Brown will have their officers on bicycles in our neighborhood.

This is a very effective method of patrol, which brings security to a community level. Officers will no longer be relegated to a vehicle that roams the area with no personal touch. Chesley Brown wants to be a part of the community and have their officers engaged with our neighbors, so when you see them say hello.

Our residents expect to receive value for their security dollars, and the AFHA board expects no less. With this new contract we have added services that you would expect when shopping on the Plaza or in Brookside. If it is late and you are walking home from a neighbor's house and need an escort, call security and they will provide an escort.

We are now awaiting the arrival of new magnets with the new security numbers on them and other frequently used numbers. Once they have arrived we will distribute them through the block captains. So watch for them.

Remember, the old magnets you may have are outdated and will not get you in touch with Chesley Brown so discard those and post the new numbers until you get your magnet. Again the numbers are 816-753-2945 or 816-753-2946.

While patrolling our homes association area, security will also be on the look out for safety issues, such as branches in the road, potholes, etc. When they see these things they will notify the City Action Center as well as the AFHA Board so we can follow up.

As accountability is a top priority for our residents, Chesley Brown provides reports to the Safety and Security Liaison for the board so we can monitor performance. If you ever have any questions about security or feedback, please contact Brian Hand for more information.



Bulk Collections

Did you know that the 29th of each month is the bulk collection day for our neighborhood? If you have bulky items which you want to dispose of, such as old furniture, appliances, large toys, old barbeque grills, etc., put them at your curb on that day. You do not need to call the City or anyone else for special notification.

No hazardous materials (such as old containers of paint or oil) are accepted; those can be taken to the City's hazardous materials drop-off site at 4707 Deramus between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays, but you must call first for an appointment. The number is 816-784-2080.

Armour Fields switched security service providers from its previous company when the original company went out of business and rolled over the contract to a new company. Brian Hand, Armour Field's security chair, felt that there were some issues with the new company's stability.

Chesley Brown International's mission, according to Josh Noland, its director of security, is "to contribute to the well being of the property...by creating and maintaining a reasonable level of safety and security.

"Chesley Brown's primary tasks are to prevent and/or detect crime, provide a safe environment, protect our clients' assets and report potential safety hazards."

Are You Paying Your Security Dues?

You probably received your annual statement of homes association dues in the mail recently. You may have noticed that the dues statement showed that a certain amount of you dues is allocated to the Armour Fields Homes Association security services.

The reason for this allocation is that, under the original Association bylaws, there was no right of the homes association board to impose dues for purposes of providing security to the residents in the homes association. When the Armour Fields board decided to start employing a neighborhood security service in 1995, it had to institute a special security assessment to pay for the cost.

Although more than half of the residents in Armour Fields voluntarily pay the security assessment, a number do not. Those residents, of course, benefit from the regular patrols of the security service even though they do not pay. They are not, however, entitled to the extra services that the patrol service provides, such as special home-watching during vacations, jumpstart/towing service, 24-hour alarm response, escorts, and calls for special service.


So if you're not paying your securities assessment...consider doing so now, so you too can help out the rest of your neighbors in paying for regular patrols, and so you can enjoy these extra services!
