coworkers. The previous administration did not offer him a renewal contract in time due to seniority complications and he moved to the Raytown School District, but Superintendent has hired him as Interim Principal for the new school.

Safe and Secure

There have been a few incidents in our neighborhood this summer that call for a heightened state of awareness in our neighborhood.

- ▶ The first that was brought to my attention is a report of a car driving through the area late at night checking for unlocked doors on parked cars. It is important to remember to secure your vehicle any time that you are not in it. Also, although it might be tempting to leave your car running in the driveway while the air conditioner is cooling it down, leaving your car open makes it an inviting target.
- ▶ The second issue is a more disturbing problem. Our security patrol informed me there have been reports of a male in a cap exposing him self to residents in the area. According to reports, he fled in a vehicle with another person driving. If you see this type of activity it is best to call to 911 immediately.
 - ▶ At least one of our Armour Fields residents has

been assaulted in recent months on the jogging trail along Wornall Road while jogging (alone) in the evening. Be sure to have a companion, if possible, when venturing into such public places after dark.

Finally, a neighbor has reported to security a person taking photos of several houses in the neighborhood. This is not an activity that is abnormal. Real estate appraisers take photos of houses in neighborhoods as comparables for houses they are appraising, and city tax assessors do the same. There may be other circumstances such as historians, designers or just architecture buffs who will take photos of houses. This practice is not illegal.

Always remember that it is important to get the best description of a person who is committing a crime or acting in a suspicious manner. It is equally important to report as much detail as you can about any vehicles involved, i.e. type, make, model, color, number of doors, license number.

We all must be sure to maintain a high level of vigilance; proactive measures are always a better deterrent than reactive measures. Don't wait until crimes are committed to be engaged. If you have any questions feel free to give me a call at the number on the back page.

Neighborhood Maz Waste Clean-Up Set for Sep. 8

Need to recycle some hazardous waste? A South Kansas City Hazardous Household Waste Clean-up will be held at the Hale Cook School, 7302 Pennsylvania, on Saturday, September 8, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

You may bring hazardous materials for disposal, including tires, brake fluid, power steering fluid, oil, antifreeze, gasoline, car batteries, road flares, fuels, 1 pound BBQ propane cylinders, household batteries, household cleaners, lawn or garden chemicals, pesticides, pool/spa chemicals, fluorescent light bulbs, expired medications (except some cancer meds), mercury thermometers/thermostats, aerosol cans, paint, paint related items like stain/stripper, leaves, brush, tires, and anything you can recycle curbside. Leaves and brush will be also be accepted, but not grass clippings.

You cannot bring explosives, fireworks, bullets, gunpowder (contact the police department to arrange disposal of those), biohazards, human or animal fluids, needles, radioactive items, smoke detectors, some cancer medications, pressurized gas cylinders, or BBQ propane cylinders larger than 1 pound, oxygen tanks, glass or Styrofoam.

The event only for Kansas City, Missouri residents, so please have proof of residence.

The homes associations sponsoring the event, including the Armour Fields Homes Association, ask each participant to bring one can of food or one dollar to donate to Harvesters.

All traffic will enter on Pennsylvania and exit on Jefferson, coming from either north or south. There's a limit how many cars can bring hazardous items, so we suggest you come early.

Materials will be accepted from residences only. Business waste is not accepted. If you can't buy an item at a store, it's probably not residential waste. Twenty gallon and 55 gallon drums are considered business waste and will not be accepted. No material in containers larger than 5 gallon buckets can be brought to this event.

Garage Sale Hosts Beware!

The Homes Association of the Country Club District (HACCD) reports to area homes associations that in several neighborhoods on both sides of the state line garage sale shoppers have passed counterfeit bills, usually \$20 bills but some \$50 and \$100 bills.

According to the police the crime isn't all that rare. The availability of textured papers and the quality of home scanners and printers make it possible for criminals to produce fairly good facsimiles of currency. Crooks count on the trusting setting of garage sales to complete the crime.

Watch for those who wait until the garage sale is busy, select several high-priced items and then pay with a large counterfeit bill.

Watch for this scam! And if you find a counterfeit bill in your cash box, call the police immediately. Passing even a small counterfeit bill is a Federal offense.

Armour Fields is One of the Area's Oldest Homes Associations

Did you know that the Armour Fields Homes Association is one of the oldest homes associations in the city?

The first homes association in the area was the Mission Hills Homes Association which turned 93 this summer. It was formed on July 21, 1914, the first of a number of homes associations founded by the J.C. Nichols Company which was then engaged in pioneering residential home development in these neighborhoods.

Seven years later, on July 5, 1921, the J.C. Nichols Company founded its second homes association, the Country Club District Homes Association along Ward Parkway near Meyer Circle.

Guard Against Identity Theft

Identity theft is become increasingly common in south Kansas City neighborhoods. The police say:

- Don't carry all personal information with you at all times.
- Make a photocopy of everything in your wallet and keep it in a safe place.
- Shred everything containing personal identifying or credit card information and don't put it in your recycling box.
- Don't leave outgoing mail in your mail slot (it has good info in it).
- Change passwords frequently.

The following year, 1922, saw the formation of four new homes associations. In July of that year the Armour Hills, Greenway Fields and Crestwood homes associations were created.

The idea was clearly catching on and was spreading throughout the developing neighborhoods south of Brush Creek.

In 1923 the Armour Fields Homes Association was created, the only one to be formed that year. Therefore, Armour Fields is the seventh oldest homes association in the area south of the Country Club Plaza.

In 1998 the Armour Fields Homes Association celebrated its 75th anniversary, and is looking forward to its 100th in 2023!

The following year, 1924, saw the formation of the Wornall Homestead, Countryside and Country Club homes associations. Stratford Gardens was formed two years later in 1926.

After that, the Roaring Twenties came to a close and a slowdown in

house development due to the sputtering of the economy caused a temporary lull in the formation of new neighborhoods.

In 1935, when the worst years of the Depression were beginning to end, the J.C. Nichols Company started up home development again with the Indian Hills Homes Association. Later in the decade, it formed three more: Tomahawk Road and Oak Meyer in 1938, and Fairway in 1939.

World War II caused another hiatus in home development, of course, but a half dozen new associations, mostly on the Kansas side, were created in the late 1940's and 1950's.

The next HACCD homes association to celebrate a major birthday will be the Corinth Hills Homes Association, formed in 1958, which will celebrate its golden anniversary next year.

Our thanks to the Homes Association of the Country Club District (HACCD) for this interesting historical information!

Southwest Planetarium Reopens

The planetarium at the former Southwest High School is operational again after a hiatus of several years! The Kansas City, Missouri school district has re-hired the original planetarium director, Bob Riddle, to head the planetarium.

Riddle is not only teaching planetarium students, but has opened the planetarium to the community.

Riddle, who holds degrees in geology and earth sciences, was the planetarium director from 1990 to 1998, when Southwest High closed. He took back his old job in January and cleaned and repaired the equipment, opening the planetarium to the public this summer. City Studying Residential Rentals

On June 28, the City Council of Kansas City, Missouri passed an ordinance which required the City Manager, with input and direction from Council designees from the Public Safety and Neighborhoods Committee, to "prepare a plan for the implementation of a program to regulate the residential rental business."

The ordinance requested that the City Manager prepare and submit to the Council proposed city ordinances within sixty days "as needed to implement the program," the ordinances to include fees that will cover the cost of the program.

The purpose of the ordinance is to address growing concerns about rental properties in the City, certain maintenance and health problems associated with them, and the regulation of residential rentals generally.

The deadline for the City Manager's response is approaching as this issue of *The Armour Star* is published, so news about the proposed ordinances should be forthcoming from the City in the coming weeks. Watch the next issue of this newsletter for a further update.


