# Country Club Community Church Update

The renovation project at Country Club Christian Church continues and significant progress is being made in its completion. There were three components of the project:

- 1. The restoration and repair of the church building including repair of the bell tower and the 125 finials and ornamental pieces.
- 2. The removal and replacement of the protective covers on all the stained glass windows.
- 3. The repair and modernization of the organ.

The masonry and structural repairs are almost complete. The cleaning is complete and the coating and sealing is almost done. The renovation and duplication of the finials and decorative pieces is about 80% finished. This work on the decorative pieces will not be finished until the spring. The large 16' finials on the bell tower will be put back in place and is one of the last tasks to be completed. Once this is done, the temporary equipment you now see on the tower will be removed.

The work on the stained glass windows is complete. The old covers that had discolored have been replaced by laminated glass. All 41 windows in the church and

chapel were updated.

The repair of the organ should now be complete. This included repairs to sections of organ pipe and wiring in the console. Once construction has been completed, the area east of the church, that is currently being used by construction crews, will revert to green space.

At the end of the construction phase there will be new sidewalks installed and landscaping done around the church. In addition, the church will be hosting a rededication ceremony in 2014. Everyone from the neighborhood is certainly invited to come to this event and further details will be forthcoming.

The congregation of Country Club Christian Church is excited about this 4 million dollar project and it's completion. We are certainly thankful for the patience and understanding the neighborhood has shown during this period. We believe the completed project will be simply stunning and add to the beauty and quality of life in the Country Club District.

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#### Great Streets 2012



The American Planning Association bestowed upon Kansas City a "Great Streets 2012" designation. The plaque was placed at the north end of the Mirror Pond (61st and Ward Parkway) in the last few months. The APA states that, "Ward Parkway is Kansas City's eminent thoroughfare, a right-of-way that begins at Country Club Plaza and transitions to a grand boulevard of manicured lawns and gardens as it follows sweeping curves southward. A commitment by both citizens and city government to maintain the parkway has allowed it to remain one of the area's most coveted addresses with historic homes, neighborhood parks, picturesque fountains, ornamental monuments, and rolling landscapes."

#### **CCDHA** Boundaries

The Country Club District Homes association is composed of two and one third subdivisions. This poses some questions about where our exact borders are located. First of all, the three subdivisions involved are Country Club Ridge, Hampstead Gardens and part of Meyer Circle.

The west boundary of our homes association is the east side of Ward Parkway. The east boundary is the west side of Summit - Valley Road. Country Club Ridge's north boundary is the south side of 57th Street. Those on the north side of 57th Street are in Sunset Hills. The south boundary is the north side of 59th Street. Hampstead Gardens begins on the south side of 59th Street and continues to the north side of 63rd Street. Cross 63rd Street and you are in Meyer Circle. Although Meyer Circle extends beyond the north side of 65th street and west of Ward Parkway, the CCDHA boundary stops there.


