The Dumpster will be located in the parking lot behind the chapel at Country Club Christian Church, 61st & Ward Parkway. Only residents of CCDHA will be allowed to use the dumpster. There will be a representative from the homes association on duty to supervise.



The following *may* be placed in the dumpster: loose scattered materials or bags of trash. No yard waste, tires, appliances or hazardous waste will be accepted. This includes paint and paint products, garden products, automotive fluids, batteries or any household chemicals. We will not be allowed to overload the dumpster. Once it is full, we will no longer accept any more materials.

This service comes to us through the Neighborhood Cleanup Assistance Program. If all goes well, we will try to have another Dumpster Day this fall and, in addition to the trash dumpster we will have one for yard waste.

NIXLE Community Text Alerts

To get information to the community as quickly as possible, the Kansas City Missouri Police Department is launching a text message alert system. Nixle Connect allows the department to instantly inform residents of current public safety issues via text/SMS, email, Internet posts, and Twitter. The service is provided at no cost to the department, taxpayers, or residents.

Communications from the KCPD range from emergency alerts such as Amber Alerts and critical incidents to routine day-today information such as violent crime suspects being sought, a burglary pattern, a major traffic incident, or other relevant information to residents. "With Nixle, citizens can be aware of the current safety issues in their neighborhood." Chief Darryl Forte' said. "Informed citizens can be our eyes and ears, helping us solve and prevent crime.

Kansas City residents can sign up to receive free, real-time safety information by texting their zip code or "KCPD" to 888777 or by visiting www.nixle.com. Once registered, users can customize the type of alerts they wish to receive via text, email, and online. Any information users submit is housed on secure Nixle servers and remains anonymous to police staff.

Nixle will also be used during

the 2012 All-Star Game by keeping traffic and people flowing as smoothly as possible, as well as a means to deliver urgent messages should an emergency arise. To receive All-Star Game specific messages, text "ALLSTARKC" to 888777.

More than 4,800 government agencies nationwide have adopted Nixle for their means of real-time communication, and more than 700,000 citizens have signed up to take advantage of the service.


