CCDHA MAP KEY


- **1.** Gracious antique urn surrounded by reblooming day lilies.
- **2.** Vintage streetlights and lighted flagpole surrounded by knockout roses.
- **3.** The lovely pedestal and basin from the fountain removed from Rooster (Schmelzer) Island (#7) are being repurposed as a planter on the western entrance from Ward Parkway to 58th St/58th Terrace. Phil and Judy Donnellan generously provided the water to ensure the sod repair made it through a very dry late August.
- **4.** Urn on limestone base was planted and maintained by Bev Elving.
- **5.** Urn surrounded by globe boxwoods was planted and maintained by Cindy Irey and Susie Luening.
- **6.** Urn surrounded by reblooming day lilies was planted and maintained by Cindy Irey and Susie Luening.
- 7. Pat Pasek has diligently tended the day lilies, salvia and roses surrounding the fountain on Rooster Island for many years. The Paseks also took on keeping water in the fountain until its deterioration made that no longer feasible.
- **8.** Graceful white blooming redbud underplanted with reblooming day lilies.
- **9.** Tall urn surrounded by horse chestnuts was planted by Bev Elving and maintained by Diane Wilmot.
- **10.** Wishing well basket planted by Nina Hollabaugh.
- **11.** Jenny Beerman kept a close eye on the landscape roses surrounding the Dove Vase statue, an antique relocated from Italy to its current location in the 1920s and restored by our homes association in the early 1990s.
- **12.** Very tall urns at entry to the neighborhood at Meyer Boulevard and Valley Road planted and maintained by Eric and Bethany Austin and Cara Newell.

CCDHA ISLAND BEAUTIFICATION

Our neighborhood stretches from 57th Street on the north to 65th Street to the south, and Ward Parkway on the west to Valley Road and Summit Street to the east.

One of the greatest pleasures of living in the Country Club District is the beauty and variety of the landscaping decorative and urns located on the twelve islands located throughout the neighborhood. While the islands are public property and owned by the City of Kansas City, which is responsible for their maintenance, the homeowners of the CCDHA have chosen for many years to devote a significant portion of the annual assessment to the beautification and care of the islands. This care includes planting and maintenance of perennial flowers and foliage plants, shrubs and ornamental trees, as well as seasonal plantings in many of the urns. It also includes the care of the fountain on Schmelzer Island (Belleview, between Huntington and 60th Terrace), which was replaced this year to once again delight the hundreds of neighbors who walk, run and bike by it daily.

The urn plantings are designed and completed by neighbors



while the larger plantings and maintenance tasks such as mowing, turf treatment, watering during extended dry periods and spring and fall cleanup are performed by a landscaping contractor. The contractor is selected by the Board each year, and the Board receives competitive bids on a biennial basis. All this work is overseen by a volunteer Beautification Committee, a group of neighbors who tour and examine all the islands each year in early spring with the landscaping contractor to develop a plan for the work to be completed that year. The committee also solicits and coordinates with the volunteers who "adopt" urns each year to plant and water.

Please join with the Board in thanking the neighbors who have been so generous with their time in planting and tending the urns this year, whose names you can see on the key to the island map. If you have an interest in gardening and a little spare time in the spring and summer to help in keeping the islands at their best, we would love to have you join us. Simply reach out to Bev Elving or any Board member and they will be happy to welcome you to the team.

Our thanks to those neighbors who have helped beautify and maintain our islands!

SCHMELZER ISLAND FOUNTAIN UPDATE

There has been significant progress in replacing the fountain on Schmelzer Island, located on Belleview between Huntington and 60th Terrace. The new (pictured here) has fountain been purchased and installation is underway. As of this writing, the new fountain is in place and awaiting completion of installation. The fountain should be full of water and operational very soon. providing a source of pleasure for district residents and the hundreds of people who walk, run, and bicycle past the island every day. The graceful bowl and pedestal from the old fountain have been moved to the island where 58th Street and 58th Terrace join at Ward Parkway. There it will serve as a decorative planter.

While water in the fountain will be flowing, the installation will not be fully complete. The Board is working with city government to finalize approvals to install a city water line and make this a self-filling and more independently operating fountain.

The Board would like to thank all the district residents whose contributions helped make this possible. Our neighbors have contributed over \$7,740 to the fountain replacement.
