# KCPD'S Citizens Police Academy

Have you ever wondered what it's like inside of a Tactical Squad armored vehicle? Or how crime scene investigators dust for prints? Or what kind of firearms training officers get? Or do you just want to know more about how the Kansas City Police Department works?

This free 10-week course starts Sept. 10th and meets every Thursday evening at the state-of-the-art police academy located at 6885 NE Pleasant Valley Road. Participants will also take field trips to places like Helicopter and Canine Units, Bomb and Arson Unit and the



Kansas City Regional Crime Laboratory. Experienced police officers and instructors offer briefings, demonstrations, and engage in frank discussions about police operations with class participants. Some of the areas explored include: accident investigation, arson and bombs, criminal investigations, firearms training, helicopter unit, homicide, hostage negotiation, K-9 unit and 911 services.


### Have You Heard of ReStore?


