

Expansion of Historic District

As many of you know, a portion of the Countryside Homes Association lies within the Simpson-Yeoman's Countryside Historic District.

Over the years there has been interest in expanding the historic district designation to include the entire homes association. The expenses of conducting the related research and reluctance from residents in blocks not currently within the historic district have made expansion of the district difficult. In spite of these challenges, residents have expressed continued interest to pursue expansion of the historic district.

In response to the continued interest, members of the board, with assistance from the City's Landmarks Commission have devised a plan to pursue the expansion of the district. The plan would include the following elements:

- Expansion of the district would be completed as an amendment of the existing district, as opposed to a new nomination.
- Expansion of the district would be completed in phases over five years, starting with those blocks where interest is greatest.
- Research would have to be completed by volunteers, preferably adult residents, who can devote the time to complete the task. The City's Landmarks Commission staff would provide the necessary training.
- The cost of pursuing expansion of the district would be covered by the homes association. Because the research would be done by volunteers, the cost would be limited to the application fee to the city, which is \$100 per building up to \$1,000. A small allowance will be provided to defray expenses associated with the research (i.e., photographs and photocopies).
- In order to maximize the homes association investment in this task, it would be
 best if whole blocks were submitted for nomination. In addition, it would be
 suggested that at least 70% of the residents of the block are in agreement that the
 block should be included in the historic district.

We are hopeful that this plan will assist in the expansion of the historic district.

If your block is interested in pursuing this plan, please contact Darryl Hawkins at 531-2221 so that a committee can be formed to pursue this important initiative. Volunteers will be needed to coordinate the research and to conduct the work.
