#### STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

#### PROPOSED BUIDING PLANS

As outlined in the procedure for Submission and Review of Proposed Building Plans there is a process that needs to be followed if you are doing an extensive remodel or addition that affects the exterior of your existing home or if you are tearing down an existing home and building a new home. In order for this to be a smooth process from start to finish, and prior to you incurring expenses on plans, etc. it is advisable to follow the Indian Fields restrictions for your block and lot and to adhere to the restrictions; and, to assure that your architect and contractor are aware of the restrictions. Recently we have had situations where the owner has gone to a great deal of time and expense to have plans drawn up that do not meet the restrictions, and

have not been approved by the Indian Fields Homes Association. To avoid this, we suggest you become familiar with the Indian Fields Restrictions. If you have friends or know of someone moving into Indian Fields and thinking about putting on an addition or tearing down and rebuilding, please let them know of the restrictions and the process we follow to keep Indian Fields a beautiful neighborhood where people choose to live, raise their families, and enjoy life.
