Enforcement of Restrictions

The Board has established procedures to ensure fair and consistent application of fines levied for non-compliance with the Declaration of Restrictions. These procedures were reviewed at the annual meeting. The procedures include:

- 1) Initial review by the Board;
- Notification letter to homeowner requesting action;
- Follow-up letter if no action is taken within 21 days of receipt;
- 4) Fines commence 10 days after receipt of second notice if issue remains unaddressed
 - \$5 per day for the first 30 days; \$10 per day, thereafter;
- If matter remains unresolved after 60 days of fines, a lien will be placed upon the property, including filing fees;
- 6) If unresolved after 120 days of fines, the association will initiate legal proceedings, with the homeowner responsible for all fines, interest, and reasonable legal fees.

The homeowner has the right to appeal the matter with the Board of Directors at any time prior to the filing of a lien.
