Happy New Year! As we all begin thinking about the upcoming year and everything that's to come in Northwood Trails, I believe it's always valuable



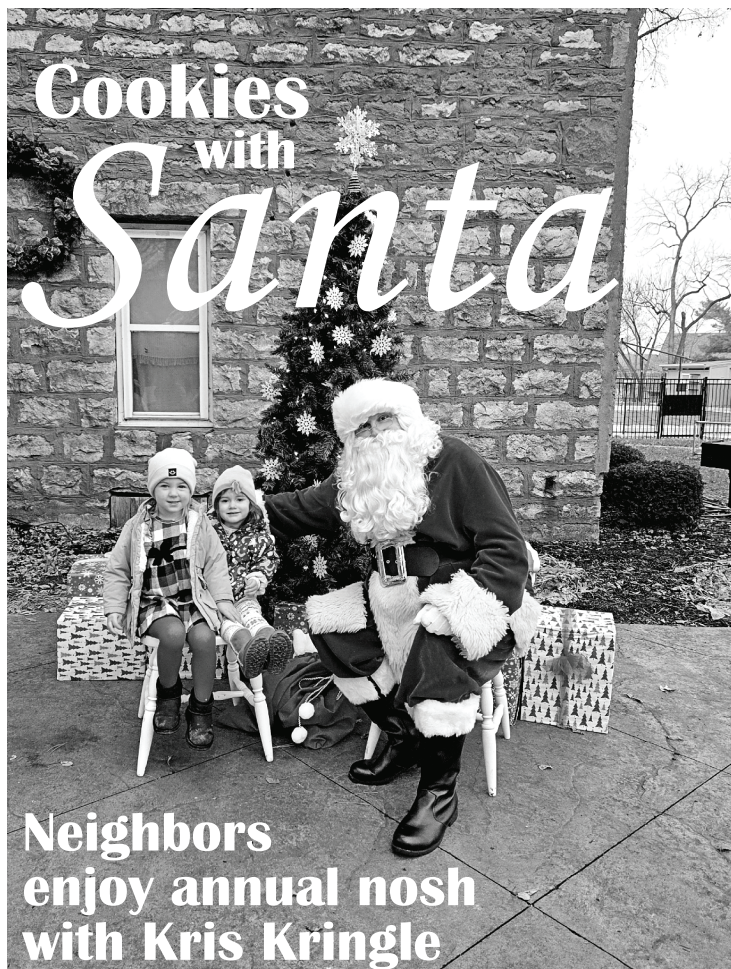
to take a step back and realize how grateful my family is for this outstanding neighborhood we get to call home. Terrific memories were made across our community in 2025.

Please share with your children that it is unsafe at any temperature to go out on the pond ice no matter how fun or solid it may appear. Per the Kansas Extension Service, it is dangerous to venture out on frozen over ponds in our area. Our area ponds and weather make it unsafe to go out on pond ice



no matter how solid it may appear! I also plead with adults to please set a good example and don't test the ice even around the outside edges. Young neighbors could see and mimic that action thinking it is OK to dangerously venture out on the pond. Thank you for your help in keeping our kids safe.

Just a reminder, folks: For any project that is being planned on your home's exterior or your property's landscape, you must submit a review request per the bylaws governing the Northwood Trails Homes Association, which you agreed to and joined when you purchased your home. This month's deed

restriction refresher is 20(b): Above ground swimming pools and above ground hot tubs are prohibited, unless completely screened in a manner approved in writing.
