

Habitat For Humanity Kansas City is opening a new ReStore location in the Waldo neighborhood! For those that have not yet discovered this fantastic resource (original ReStore located at 4701 Deramus, by the Chouteau Bridge), Habitat ReStore is a discount home improvement center that accepts donations of building supplies (those are tax deductible contributions) and makes the merchandise available to the general public at deeply discounted prices. The profits go to the mission of Habitat For Humanity KC and all those materials headed for the landfill are diverted...kept in the circle of life. The new location will be accepting and selling furniture as well.

The new ReStore location will be at 303 W. 79th Street, the former Mar-beck store. We were all sad when such an institution as Mar-beck left the area but it is very exciting that the vacancy will be filled by this outstanding resource, both for those that have building supplies and gently used furniture to donate and those that are in search of an economical path to maintain homes or find that special piece of furniture to enhance a the living room.

ReStore staff will be spending the next few months modifying the interior of the building to suit the needs of this operation, setting up racks and shelves, moving in merchandise and, in general, getting ready to open the doors. They hope to start accepting donations by mid September and are shooting for the first part of November to be open for business. 

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St Teresa's Update

Dear Homes Association Friends,

Over the past few months, St. Teresa's Academy hosted several neighborhood meetings with area homeowners as well as a newly formed Task Force representing the homes associations. These meetings included open and honest dialogue about St. Teresa's plans to construct a fourth building on its campus and expand its existing parking lot. We are grateful for your input and participation in this process.

On August 24, 2010, representatives of St. Teresa's and several neighbors appeared before the Board of Zoning Adjustment regarding a requested variance to allow for the expansion of St. Teresa's existing parking lot. The additional 35 parking spaces are designed to allow more students to park on campus, and are in response to concerns raised by neighbors regarding side street parking. The BZA granted St. Teresa's application for the variance, and construction on the parking lot is expected to begin in the Fall of 2010. St. Teresa's encourages its students to carpool and has established a Parking Policy for students and activities to reduce parking on side streets. The Athletic Department will communicate with visiting schools about appropriate parking and carpooling. If a significant increase in parking is anticipated, St. Teresa's will notify neighbors of major campus events in HOA Newsletters and will display signs that direct appropriate parking to the main campus. One such upcoming occasion is St. Teresa's Homecoming, which will be held in the M&A Building on the evening of September 25, 2010. "No Parking" signs will be placed along the east side of Wyandotte and Westover for this event. St. Teresa's will continue to meet regularly with the Task Force, and will work in partnership with that group to keep neighbors informed. St. Teresa's Academy has been a part of this community for more than 100 years, and we look forward to continuing the good relations we have with our neighbors.

St Teresa's neighbor meeting to discuss their coming and proposed changes



STA Meeting:

Concerned neighbors met August 9, 2010 with St. Teresa's Academy (STA) President Nan Bone, STA Athletic Director, Gould Evans architects, civil engineers, and STA board members to discuss the high school's \$4.6 million capital campaign project that will add a new chapel building with four high-tech classrooms, a grotto, additional parking, enhanced landscaping, new tennis courts, and 400-meter athletic track. The group addressed concerns previously-identified at an April 13 Neighbor Meeting and a May 6 Task Force session before answering lingering questions regarding off-campus parking, student carpooling, campus views of from the surrounding neighborhood, security, mature trees, storm water drain-off, litter, future events, noise, bleacher seating, and lighting. In response to neighbor concerns, St. Teresa's has abandoned former plans to ask the city to vacate the curved street section on the northwest corner of campus that connects to the Country Side island for its new track. St. Teresa's and Country Side Homeowners Association work together each year on projects such as our Easter Egg Hunt and Spring/Fall Cleanup Days. New UMKC Student Union Tour




UMKC New Student Union Tour:

Assistant Chancellor for Campus Facilities Bob Simmons led neighbors from surrounding neighborhoods and students on a tour of UMKC's new state-of-the-art Student Union September 1, 2010. The innovative \$38.3 million, 109,000-square-foot showpiece will likely earn LEED silver and possibly gold certification for its sustainable design, use of recycled materials, vaulted ceilings with natural lighting, electricity and water reduction, and rooftop garden. Other features include a spectacular view of campus and the Plaza, four restaurants, a 6,300-square-foot multipurpose area, meeting rooms and an underground 329-seat theater. The new Union was financed through a 2008 campus referendum that approved an additional \$13.75 in student fees to pay for construction.
