Kansas City in 2006, and living in apartment for several years, they joined our community in OMG with the purchase of the "old Kauffman place" in 2008.


Riker is an emergency physician at Children's Mercy Hospital and is on faculty as an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics, University of Missouri-Kansas City.




OMG by the NUMBERS
