Annual Dues


Some have asked. "Must I pay the annual dues?"

Scrumptious Eggs

1 pound Monterey jack cheese, shredded

3/4 pound fresh mushrooms, sliced

1/2 large onion, chopped

1/8 cup butter or margarine, melted

1 cup cubed ham

7 eggs, beaten

1-3/4 cups milk

1/2 cup flour

1 TBS. parsley, chopped

1 tsp. seasoned salt

Place half the cheese in bottom of buttered 9 x 13 inch dish. Saute mushrooms and onion in butter or margarine until tender; place over cheese. Spread ham over mushroom-onion mixture and top with rest of cheese. If desired, cover and refrigerate until ready to bake. When ready, beat together eggs, milk, flour, parsley and seasoned salt. Pour evenly over casserole. Bake uncovered in a 350-degree oven 45 minutes. Serves 10.

Fiesta Dip

1 c. mayonnaise

2 c. shredded Monterey Jack Cheese w/ jalapeno peppers 1/2 c. sour cream

1 medium tomato - chopped

1 package (1.8 oz) Knorr Leek Soup & Recipe Mix Melba Snacks or any hard cracker

In medium bowl combine all the above (except Melba snacks)
