President's Message

Our first annual Fourth of July Parade this past summer was quite successful. We estimated that there were about 80 people there, half adults, half youngsters, who all seemed to have a good time. From Triangle Park we paraded up 58th Street, across Wyandotte to 58th Terrace, and then back down to the park, accompanied along the way with patriotic music. Not a few families were out on their porches watching and waving as we all marched by, on bicycles, tricycles, wagons, strollers, or on foot. Back at the park, we all enjoyed Popsicles, many of us several times. The festivities concluded with the awarding of prizes for best bike, tricycle and wagon decorations (see photos on separate page in this issue). We are already planning how to make next year's parade even better.



Your Board has decided to pursue the purchase of <u>banners</u> for our homestead. The banners would be placed on light poles at the four corners of our neighborhood, and two more on Huntington, one near Wornall and the other near Brookside.

There has been sparse interest in either increased secu-

<u>rity</u> or additional <u>snow plowing</u>, so the Board has dropped those issues. If anyone, however, is still concerned about either, you can email any of us or bring up the issues at our Annual Business Meeting in November.



In last September's Newsletter, I reported on the average



price of home sales in our homestead from 2000 to 2005. For 2006, the average price of sold homes for us was \$283,081, up from \$258,760 in 2005. The number of houses sold in 2006 was 13, right in keeping with the l3.5% so far this century, but the days these houses were on the market be-

fore selling (DOM) jumped from 2005's 35 days to 55 for 2006. So far this year, 7 houses have sold in our homestead, the average sale price has been \$284,621, and the DOM has been 112 days. Those figures support the claim that we are currently in a buyer's market. Sellers be aware!


