Our Neighborhood's Architectural History

Wornall Homestead has an incredible array of residences designed by notable architects. We will present a variety of these in the newsletter in coming issues:

Ever wonder who designed the house with the beautiful tower at 58th and Wyandotte? It was Ludwig Abt.

Ludwig Abt was an aggressive and energetic architect who was able to pursue to advantage his profession in a new society in a new world. He emigrated from Germany and after working in several US cities, he decided to return to Germany for further studies, especially in the use of reinforced concrete. He returned and settled in Kansas City for awhile then answered the need for knowledge of reinforced concrete. Frank Lloyd Wright was one of the first American architects to exploit this material in 1910. After working for a while, Abt decided to settle in Moberly, Missouri. A quest for knowledge and pursuit of the best way to create buildings and solve practical problems became a characteristic of Mr. Abt's work. Mr. Abt's advertising motto was "Ludwig Abt, Architect, Ideas Furnished" and this is what he did. He became world known for his designs of churches, movie palaces and colleges----often his buildings became the most important elements in many communities. Abt later brought in Kay Cleavinger, a young architect and the firm eventually became J.K. Cleavinger & Associates.

Our only example of Abt's work (and one of few in Kansas City) is 5736 Wyandotte Street—the house with the beautiful tower. The permit was issued on 5-10-1912 for a residence for Frank J. Engleman. It was developed by Hollyman Realty Company and cost a whopping \$7,000 to build in 1912. By Eric Yougberg



Island Plan Huntington & Brookside

The island at Huntington & Brookside is being readied for some major changes. Construction will start soon and the include the return of the "Birds in flight" sculpture, a new stone wall and new landscaping. Construction should start in late October and the landscaping will most likely be installed in the spring. The plans include a 30" high x 24' long limestone wall with a precast sign for Wornall Homestead. This will serve as a main entrance into the area and identify the historical significance of our neighborhood. We will have 3 large one ton boulders to frame the landscaping and protect the island and sculpture from any wayward cars coming off Brookside.



Landscaping will include native grasses like Karl Forester feather reed grass, dwarf fountain grass, autumn red switch grass. Some feature plants like Tiger Eye Sumac and dwarf arctic fire dogwoods and for some color, red carpet roses.

Our plan has been approved by the City. Funding for this project has come from a Public Improvement Grant from the City. The \$15,000. grant includes the refurbishment of the sculpture, wall and Landscaping. Come to the annual meeting and hear more about what the Planning Committee is working on.
