Reminder to keep garage doors closed

While most door to door solicitors may be legitimate, it's prudent to keep your garage door closed as stated in Westmont's Declaration of Restrictions—unless you're working in or near it. Be alert for scams and remember that the elderly are often targets/victims. If there's anything suspicious tell the salesperson, "Westmont has a no solicitation ordinance." *If the person persists, call the police.*

Spring lawn tips by Ryan Black of Summit Lawn & Landscape

Spring has sprung and here are some tips to get your lawns started off on the right track:

■The first round of pre-emergent fertilizer will be done the last week in March and will need to be watered for better effectiveness. We'll post a flyer on your mailboxes the day we do the application so look for it when you get your mail. *If you have an irrigation system we recommend running it for 15-30 minutes per zone.* (Summit can turn it on for you at a discounted \$50—normally \$70. Dates we're available: 3/29, 4/4, 4/14, 4/19, 4/29, 5/4, 5/12. Ask for Amy when you call or email her at amy@summitlawn.com).

Seed your lawn where needed but keep in mind that fall is best since the pre-emergent we put down in the spring prevents grass seed from growing as quickly and there's also competition from weeds.

■Leaf clean-up will be done the end of March before the first round of pre-emergent with both front and back yards included.

A light raking of your yard to clean up matted-down grass is beneficial to promoting a fast green-up.

Spring is the time to mulch your beds, prune and treat roses for disease, cut back perennial grasses and ornamentals, and add shrubs to your landscape.
