Tree Trimming Reminder – Late fall and early winter are an ideal time to get your trees trimmed. With most trees going dormant, trimming during November and December reduces stress on the tree and promotes healthier growth in spring. The lack of leaves also gives arborists better visibility to identify weak or damaged branches, improving the overall safety and appearance of your property. If your trees need attention, now is the perfect time to schedule a trim.

Non-Resident Homeowners – Please be sure your rental property is registered with the City of Overland Park as a "rental". The city requires all rental properties be licensed and inspected. Failure to do this can result in a fine. The city has advised us they will be enforcing this ordanance more strictly in 2026.

On-Street Parking – As winter approaches, please be mindful of where and how you park. Snow removal, narrower streets, and slippery conditions can make on-street parking both hazardous and inconvenient for your neighbors. Whenever possible, please use your convenient two-car garage or driveway instead of parking on the street. Your cooperation helps keep our community safer and our roads clear during the winter months.

Dusk-to-Dawn Light Bulbs – We still have a supply of bulbs available at no charge. If you're interested, please contact me or any Board member. These bulbs have made a noticeable difference in brightening our neighborhood and helping keep it safe.
